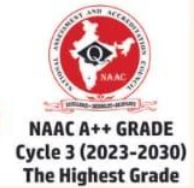

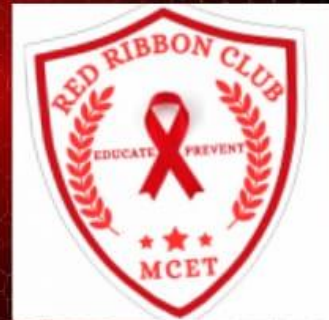

REPORT

A Blood Donation Camp was successfully conducted on 28th August 2024 at the CC Hall, in collaboration with the Primary Health Centre, Kanjampatti, and the Indian Medical Association, Pollachi. The primary objective of the camp was to promote awareness on the significance of voluntary blood donation and to contribute to the availability of blood for critical medical needs. (Maximum of 30 teams with 3 members per Team)

Round 1 - Test your Skills :

Participants will receive a set of questions (in online mode) with multiple choice where they have to select the most appropriate or suitable answers. At the end teams will be shortlisted based on their performance.

Number of teams: 30

Round 2 - Quiz Popping :

The topic is decided at the first and we provide the clues in regular period of time to find the words or names or movies. The teams have answered in minimum number of clues will get maximum number of points. At the end, teams with Maximum number of points will be selected for next round.

Number of teams: 15

Round 3 – Balloon Cage:

REPORT

Event Overview:

The SGS Organization hosted Varnam 2k25, a vibrant and engaging event. The YRCRRC club organized the signature competition "Chronos Clash," which included three exciting rounds to challenge participants' skills, teamwork, and creativity. A total of 25 teams, each consisting of three members, participated with great enthusiasm.

Round 1: Solve the Puzzle

This round featured a 30-question quiz conducted on the online platform Mentimeter. It was designed to enhance participants' mental acuity and thinking abilities through an interactive and engaging format. All 25 teams competed, showcasing their problem-solving skills. Based on the Mentimeter leaderboard, the top 15 teams advanced to the next round.

Round 2: Quiz Popping

In this buzzer-based round, the selected 15 teams faced 15 challenging questions. Each question was accompanied by five clues revealed at 10-second intervals. This round focused on improving participants' listening and reaction speed while maintaining a high-energy competitive atmosphere. Teams had to press the buzzer to answer, with only the fastest getting the opportunity to respond. By the end of this round, six teams qualified for the final round.

Round 3: Human Cage

The final round tested participants' teamwork and strategic planning skills. Teams formed a human cage structure while volunteers added balloons at 10-second intervals. The objective was to maintain the cage's structure while holding the maximum number of balloons. This round brought out the best in team coordination and problem-solving. Ultimately, three teams emerged as winners, demonstrating exceptional collaboration and creativity.
